The Bundhoo Family of Pietermaritzburg

The pioneering member of the Bundhoo family, Gopal, arrived in this country towards the third quarter of the century and settled at Sutherlands near Pietermaritzburg. He came of farming stock from the upper reaches of Bihar. Gopal was accompanied by his son Ratchai. Both father and son has spent some years on the island of Mauritius where they had worked on the cane-fields. The Sutherlands area became the home of succeeding generations of the family. Bundhoo was the third son of Ratchai. He was born in 1888 and at the age of seventeen joined his father in the family business established by Ratchai just after the Boer War, the first retail business in the area. He took part in the Ghandi Campaign and was a foundation member of several social and religious institutions in the Sutherlands area. He died at the age of seventy eight.
