

GITAY, Bapoo Sahib; b. Pabra, Habsan, Kokan, 1880; *educ.* Pabra. Came to South Africa in 1902, first stayed in Cape Town; soon after removed to Kimberley, where is now resident. Is engaged in business as a wholesale dealer in tropical fruit. *Public activities*: former treas. of the Indian Political Asscn. 1925-28; treas., Indian Welfare Asscn. from 1929 up to the present time; takes part in all matters affecting the Indian community. *Address*: 74, George St., Kimberley, Cape Province.



GODFREY, James Walter; 3rd s. of late S. Godfrey; b. Mauritius, July 6, 1881; *educ.* Boys' Model School, Durban and private study. Passed Natal Civil Service competitive exam, 1899; called to the Bar from Lincoln's Inn, 1907; admitted to the Natal Bar as advocate, solicitor and conveyancer, 1907. Before leaving for legal studies served as shorthand writer and typist to Mr. M. K. Gandhi; in 1906 acted as his secretary in London. *m.* Grace Pappamall, 4th d. of late S. D. Cornelius, of Vepery, Madras. In 1881 came to Natal, then an infant of three months. Now practising in Durban as advocate, solicitor and conveyancer. *Public activities*: Presdt. of the N.I.C.; former presdt., serving two terms of office of the S.A.I.C.; a leader of the South African Indian Congress deputation to India in connection with the Class Areas Bill agitation, 1925. *V.*-presdt., Indo-European Joint Council. Member of the Gandhi Library Committee. He inaugurated the St. John Ambulance movement among Indians in Durban, being one of its officers. Repstd. the Indian Anglican Church at Synod and was a member of the Natal Diocesan Board. Assisted the Passive Resistance movement in the Northern District, 1913; appeared as advocate for Mr. Gandhi, who was convicted at Dundee, as being the strike leader in 1913. 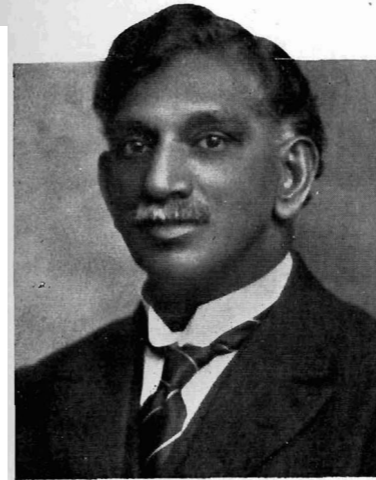

Made pilgrimage to Mecca in 1920. On return continued interests in all public affairs affecting non-Europeans and Indians; took prominent part in reception accorded to H.H. Sultan of Zanzibar, H.H.
