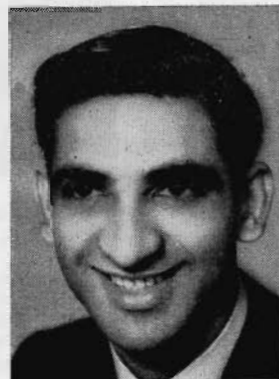


## THE A. E. ENGAR FAMILY



**ENGAR, Gulam Mahomed**, baker and merchant; s. of Mr. and Mrs. Ismail Essop Engar; b. Port Shepstone, Nov. 13, 1925; m. Zorina, d. of Ismail Moosa, of Durban; 2 s., 1 d.; educ. Port Shepstone Govt.-aided Ind. Sch., matriculated at Sastri College in 1945. Was partner in mother's business. After her death in 1954, was joined by his brother as partner, later estd. Port Shepstone Manufacturing Co. and the Port Shepstone Trading Store. Pub. act.: Trustee, Engar Education Trust; asst. sec. Port Shepstone Child Welfare Society; com. mem. Santa (South Coast Branch); treas. Port Shepstone Football and Cricket Union; com. mem. Port Shepstone School Meals Service. Rec.: Tennis. **ENGAR, Amodjee Ebrahim**, general merchant; s. of Ebrahim Mamoojee Engar; b. Todkeshwar, India, 1876, died Durban in Dec., 1932; 2 d. Came to Natal in 1886, was first employed as salesman at Isipingo; in 1906 estd. first Indian store, trading as Port Shepstone Trading Co.; estd. bakery in 1921; foundation member and trustee, Port Shepstone Mosque and Madressa; foundation mem. of Port Shepstone Educational Soc., which created first English-medium school in the district; in 1927 opened store at Paddock and was a foundation mem. of Paddock Madressa Trust. A generous donor to charities and created the Engar Education Trust. Went on pilgrimage with his wife in 1920.

**ENGAR, Rassool Amodjee**, d. of late Amodjee Ebrahim Engar; b. Todkeshwar, India, 1900; came to S.A. in 1906; m. Ismail Essop Engar, of Port Shepstone; 2 s., 5 d. Traded at Paddock 1932 and was large property-owner at Port Shepstone; bequeathed £2,500 for a primary English school at Marburg; bequeathed £500 for deserving persons for pilgrimage to Mecca. Died Jan., 1954.



**GABRIEL, Rev. Father Leo, A.C.**, O.M.I.; b. Durban 1910; educ. St. Patrick's College, Jaffna, Ceylon and Dominican University "Angelico", Rome, Italy; Parish Priest St. Anthony's Ind. & Coloured Congregation, Pmburg, for past 25 years; founder of "Our Lady of Good Health" of Velanganni at Raisenhorpe, Pmburg; founder St. Anthony's Parish Centre,

St. Anthony's Govt.-aided Indian Sch., Carlisle Street; matriculated Sastri College 1936; first Indian to obtain B.Sc. (Union of S.A.) at Fort Hare Univ. College 1939; completed Diploma in

Educ. 1940; while at Fort Hare took part in several dramatic and light opera productions; was assistant school master at Stanger Government and Greyville Government schools in 1940; commenced medical studies at University of Witwatersrand in 1941; graduated M.B., Ch.B. in 1945; was house surgeon-physician to Lovedale Hospital in 1946; commenced general practice at Port Shepstone in 1947, where he now resides; m. Dr. Matilda Prema Royeppen, e. d. o. Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Royeppen in 1954. Vice-pres. Port Shepstone Indian Child Welfare and Benevolent Society; past chairman F.O.S.A. Port Shepstone area Care Committee; hon. physician to Port Shepstone Indian Child Welfare and Benevolent Society and FOSA Care Committee; active member Roman Catholic Church. Interests: Music.
