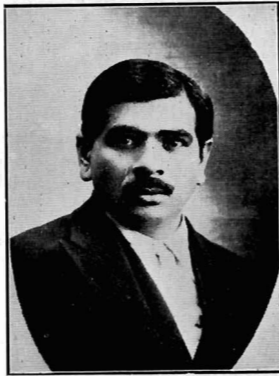


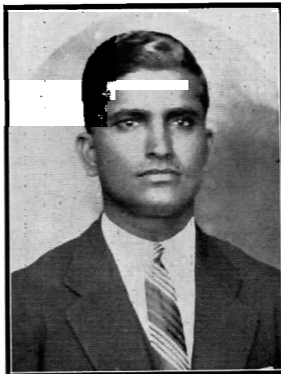
JHAVERI, Omar Hajee Amod ; b. Porbandar, Kathiwar, India, about 1873 ; *educ.* Boys' Model School, Smith Street, Durban. Came to South Africa at the beginning of 1883, settled in Durban, where he has resided ever since. *Public activities* : This dates since his arrival, being an early associate of Mahatma Gandhi ; was presdt., S.A.I.C. (twice) ; has been a member of N.I.C. since 1905 ; joint secty. 1906 ; twice chairman of the Orient Club ; chairman and trustee of the Jerbai Rustomjee Trust and the Rustomjee Gorkoodo Trust and Jivenji Trust ; chairman of the M. K. Gandhi Library ; one of the trustees of Mahatma Gandhi's Phoenix Settlement ; chairman and trustee of the Grey Street Juma Masjid Trust ; Toured Europe, America and Northern Africa, 1904 ; visited all parts of India in 1908. 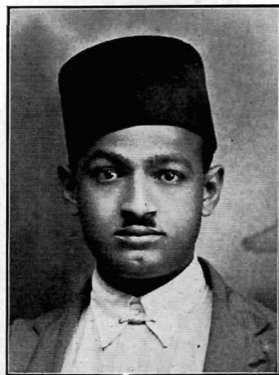
JIVAN, Vallabh ; b. Degam, 1898 ; *educ.* Degam. Came to South Africa, 1912, residing first at Pretoria. Moved to Leslie, staying here for three years, then to Morgenzen. In 1918, with partners, started firm of J. Doolab & Co., general dealers, Davel and is also a partner in the firm of D. K. Vallabh & Co., Breyten. An active member of the Transvaal Prajapati Asscn., a body which is strenuously striving for the advancement of its community. A generous donor to all deserving appeals. *Address* : P.O. JOHN, M. ; 3rd s. of Muthusamy Pillay, late of Verulam, Natal ; b. Stanger, Jan. 27, 1897 ; *educ.* Government Indian School, Stanger, and later private study ; m. Vathsala, 3rd d. of R. N. Moodley, of Pietermaritzburg, Natal, May, 1927. 3 s. Employed with Ellams, Limited, Durban, for 25 years. *Public activities* : Secty.-treas. Colonial Born Indian and Settlers' Asscn., 1934-35. Held various official positions in sports with distinction, being associated with the D.D.I.F.A. for over 25 years, during which period has held the offices as secty., treas., v.-presdt. and presdt. Secty. and treas. of the Natal Indian Football Asscn., 1926-27, and tackled, with great success, the first Inter-Provincial tournament for the Sam China Cup in Natal ; in 1932 was elected secty. of the S.A.I.F.A. and during his term of office was one of those largely responsible for the tour of the All-India soccer team to South Africa in 1934, the first to come out after negotiations extending for past twenty years or more. Was chairman and secty. of the Durban Indian Referees' Asscn. ; secty. and treas. of the Natal Indian Referee's Asscn. ; presdt. of numerous F.C.'s in Durban ; councillor of N.I.F.A. and S.A.I.F.A. ; executive member S.A.I.C., representing Griqualand West and Transvaal ; v.-presdt., secty. and treas. of the D.D.I.C.U., in different years ; presdt., the first secty. and treas. of N.I.C.U., in different years ; foundation member of the Durban Indian Sports Grounds Association, and member of numerous other commissions and committees to deal with sports. *Address* : C/o Ellams, Ltd., P.O. JINA, Ahmed Mahomed ; b. Kholvad, 1900 ; *educ.* Kholvad. Came to South Africa in 1916 settling at Carolina. After a term of private employment joined brothers in business of E. M. Jina, with which he is still connected. Was presdt. of the Carolina Sports Club, and capt. of Carolina Cricket Club. Takes keen interest in all affairs affecting the Indian community. Visited Kashmir in 1927. *Publications* : described his experiences in Gujarati, on his Indian travels in a series of Press articles. ← **JHAVERI, Hajee Ismail Aboobaker** ; b. Durban, 1878 ; *died* Durban, 1925. When three years of age went to India, remaining till 1913. On his return to South Africa he was engaged in business ; also connected with the firm of the East Indian Trading Co. Re-visited Porbandar in 1916, where he took a prominent part in public activities, becoming the leader of the Muslim community ; presiding at the Kathiwar Muslim Educational Society at Porbandar in 1918. Was the chairman of the Porbandar Jooma Mosque Managing Committee and of the Madressa Managing Committee. Was highly respected by all sections of the community, among whom included His Highness the Rana Sahib of Porbandar. He was an esteemed friend of Mahatma Gandhi. He died at the age of 47, leaving a widow and two sons.

JHAVERI, Aboobaker Hajee Ismail ; b. Porbandar, Sept. 21, 1909 ; *educ.* Porbandar and Marine College, Durban ; m. Rabia, o. d. of Khan Bahadur Hajee Cassim Adam, of Pretoria. *Hobby* : Sport. *Address* : (In India) Jhaveri Bldgs., Porbandar. (In Durban) 160, Grey St., Durban, Natal.

JHAVERI, Aboobaker Hajee Ahmed ; b. Porbandar, 1850 ; *died* in Bombay, Aug., 1887. Came to South Africa from Mauritius in 1872, being the first Indian, following in the wake of the Indian immigrants, to start business in Durban in 1872. He also extended his activities to include the Transvaal, where he acquired landed properties, which until recently, were the only land registered in an Indian's name in that Province. During his short stay in this country, he became a popular member of the Indian community. He was of a public-spirited nature, generously contributing towards the upkeep of several institutions. Unfortunately he became a victim of a cholera epidemic then raging in Bombay, where he passed away at the early age of 37. He was survived by his only son, Hajee Ismail Aboobaker Jhaveri.
